



## UNDERGRADUATE STUDENT RESEARCH POLICY & COUNTY MASK MANDATES

Beginning, January 7, 2022, the Salt Lake Department of Public Health requires respirators (or until you are able to obtain a respirator, a well-fitting mask or face covering as an alternative) in public spaces while indoors (or queueing outdoors) from January 8 through February 7, 2022.

The following COVID-19 safety restrictions will still be in effect.

- 1) The student and the student's supervisor agree to follow all safety and other protocols specified by the State and University at <https://coronavirus.utah.edu/>
- 2) Students and all researchers are expected to participate in COVID-19 [protocols](#).
  - Test weekly for COVID-19, even if asymptomatic
  - Get vaccinated against COVID-19 and get a booster when eligible
  - If you test positive, or are unvaccinated and exposed to COVID-19 follow the 5-5-5 rule\*
- 3) Researchers are to stay up-date on [allowable research status](#). The current status is [modified research activities](#).
- 4) For large group gathering, researchers will follow [best practices](#) for in-person events and gatherings.
