




# **R&D Portfolio: University of Utah**




# **Grant Dollars by Grants per Faculty**







Total Vendor and Subaward Expenditures on Federal and Non-Federal Research Awards to the University of Utah by County in FY 2023




Total Vendor and Subaward Expenditures on Federal and Non-Federal Research Awards to the University of Utah by Utah Counties FY 2023




# Employees paid on research dollars 2023



### **SOURCES OF FEDERAL FUNDING IN FY 2024**







#### Research Expenditures in FY2024




### AWARDED RESEARCH FUNDING BY COLLEGE




### % CHANGE IN # OF RESEARCH AWARDS BY COLLEGE




### AWARDED RESEARCH FUNDING BY DEPARTMENT



#### % CHANGE IN AWARDED RESEARCH FUNDING FOR THE TOP 25 DEPARTMENTS












#### **RESEARCH EXPENDITURES**







# FY24 F&A Distributions to Colleges/Institutes




